## Winnicott's **Angels** and Mannocci's **Clouds** A psychoanalytic reflection on **'The Annunciation'**

#### Key words:

Donald Winnicott - Lino Mannocci - psychoanalysis - The Annunciation - ordinary devotion - primary creativity - communicating - unconscious - emotional development - writing - painting

'The Annunciation' plays a major theme in the work of the Italian artist Lino Mannocci. The psychoanalyst Donald Winnicott focuses on the mother-infant dyad and shows how this early relationship forms the Self. Ordinary devotion by a good enough mother facilitates primary creativity in the baby from the beginning of life. These Winnicottian concepts, central to clinical psychoanalysis, are also pertinent to the themes emanating from Mannocci's writings and paintings.

With reference to a selection of ancient woodcuts and engravings of The Annunciation that inspired Mannocci's recent monotypes, this talk will reflect on the parallels between clinical psychoanalysis and the artist's creative endeavour. Thus, the aim of the talk is to illuminate some hidden elements in **The Annunciation** related to the **unconscious** and the **emotional development** of each individual.

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
